

Jimmy Reid Triumphs at U.S. Open



NORFOLK - Floridian Jimmy Reid outrivaled the superstar field with a 6-1 record during the prestigious 10th Annual U.S. Open. In races to eleven, Reid defeated Hunter (10), Bollman (0), Mathews (8), Crane (3), LeBron (6), lost to LeBron (4), and then defeated LeBron (5) for the U.S. Open title and \$7,800 first prize. Q-Master Billiards played host to fifty men and twenty women in the double elimination events.

ACCU-FACT

With two major 9-ball events yet to play, 133 players have shared \$380,242.00 in prize money. Of this total, the top ten paid players received 233,753.00. Last year's total payoff for major 9-ball tournaments was \$433,512.00.

Of the 331 players who have played in major 9-ball events this year, only 73 have won more sessions than they lost.

Reid Saves Best for Last

The Longest Running Major Tournament

On November 5, 1985, fifty of the best pool players in the world assembled at Barry Behrman's Q-Master Billiards in Norfolk, Virginia to compete in The 10th Annual U.S. Open. Each paid \$300 for the chance to claim a share of the \$22,810 purse. As well as promoting and hosting the event, Barry Behrman added \$7,800 to the men's entrance fees and kept Q-Master open 24 hours a day.

But, before the tournament began, some very important business had to be taken care of. At the player's meeting, several issues were voted on which resulted in the lengthening of the sessions from ten to eleven games and the outlawing of the short jump cue. By popular demand, the players chose to rack themselves, with the exception of the finals in which the referee would rack the balls. OK, on with the tournament! (continued on page 10)

Notable Matches

"Notable Matches" has become a very popular segment of Accu-Stats. Here, we review matches worthy of note. The number in parentheses is the player's TPA for that session.

In a first round match, Earl Strickland (.945) got off to a good start by drubbing Danny Medina (.313) 11-0. Earl held Medina to pocketing just five balls for the entire session.

In another first round contest, Efren Reyes (.864) proved to be more than a match for Woody Woodhouse (.525) as he chalked up his third shutout of the year.

What a finish! John Brinkley (.780) took a commanding lead, 10-5, over Ralph Curry (.805). Although Curry had missed nine shots already, he would miss no more. He made his drive and closed the gap applying unneeded pressure to Brinkley. At 10-10, with three balls on the table, Brinkley missed an easy shot setting the stage for a Curry victory. Curry ran the last three balls without a hitch. The crowd applauded, Brinkley and Curry approached each other for the customary post game handshake, but wait...the cue ball did not stop rolling yet and may scratch in the side pocket. The handshake was put on hold for just one more second as everyone watched the cue ball disappear. The players completed the handshake but for different reasons, Brinkley 11, Curry 10.

While defeating Pete Tascarella (.618) 11-4, Louie Lemke (.861) caught a stroke and ran forty-three consecutive balls without leaving the table.

In another hard-to-believe shutout, Jimmy Reid (.901) crushed Dave Bollman (.500) 11-0.

Steve Mizerak (.892) came out second best in one of the best played matches of the tournament. Howard Vickery (.912) was trailing 8-10 with Mizerak breaking. Mizerak didn't make anything on the break and Vickery proceeded to run the next three racks which included a kick-in during the case game!

Although Don Polo (.843) pocketed 102 balls and Danny DiLiberto (.746) pocketed just 53, Polo just barely edged out DiLiberto 11-10.

In the best played match by both players, Earl Strickland (.902) fell victim to Efren Reyes (.927). Both players pocketed a total of 176 balls and missed just two shots apiece.

Mike LeBron (.830) and Efren Reyes (.841) won the Most Exciting Session Award. With only three players left in the tournament, Reyes jumped ahead of LeBron 5-2. LeBron then never missed a shot as he took the lead 10-6. (Now the fun began.) At 10-6, it appeared that LeBron was running out but miscued! New score: 10-7. It now appeared that LeBron was running out again but missed a very easy shot. New score: 10-8. Once again, it appeared that LeBron was running out but hooked





The tournament arena featured three tight pocketed Gold Crowns with bleacher seating for about 200 spectators. The director and producer of "The Color of Money", which is the sequel to "The Hustler", along with star Tom Cruise were in attendance. They came to meet players and experience a genuine tournament.

Accu-Stats was on hand "sweating" matches and showing off its new LED message display. After 1,696 racks and 13,675 balls pocketed, the results were in. The U.S. Open produced fourteen "wire" matches, three shutouts, and twenty .900 TPA's. Honorable mention goes to Efren Reyes who continues to play exceptional 9-ball by posting the high TPA tournament average of .879 which included five of the tournament's twenty .900's.

Reid's Route

Jimmy Reid nearly lost his first match just edging Bob Hunter 11-10. He then trounced Dave Bollman 11-0 and continued his winning ways with Mathews, Crane, and LeBron until LeBron came back from the loser's bracket to avenge the previous loss. LeBron did win the first match but needed another win to clinch the

himself and tried a masse'. New score: 10-9. Reyes then made the 9-ball on the break! New score: 10-10. Reyes didn't make anything on the next break and LeBron did run out. LeBron 11, Reyes 10.

Both Jimmy Reid (.948) and Mike LeBron (.843) had one loss and were forced to play one last session for the championship. With the score knotted at 5-5, LeBron (.843) missed a bank shot and never stepped up to the table again! Reid (.948) ran the rest of that rack and then very skillfully broke and ran out the next five racks for the U.S. Open victory!

title. It was not to be, for Reid put together the tournament high run of five racks and posted the highest TPA session of .948!

Men's Finals

Mike LeBron and Jimmy Reid both had one loss and necessitated one more session to determine the 1985 U.S. Open champion. The session began with each player taking advantage of every mistake. For instance, if LeBron missed a shot, Reid ran out. If Reid scratched, LeBron ran out. The neck-and-neck race continued in this manner until the score was 5-5. Then, after Reid failed to make a ball on the break, LeBron ran the first six balls and missed a bank. It would be his last turn at the table for Reid ran the remaining balls of that rack and then for the grand finale, broke and ran out the last five racks for an 11-5 deserving win!

Belinda Wins Again

Q-Master Billiards added \$2,000 to the women's division of the U.S. Open which was held prior to the men's event, November 1-3, 1985. Twenty women competed for the \$6,000 purse with Belinda Campos Beardon backing up her WPBA Championship win with a U.S. Open win. Beardon this time went undefeated.

What's Next?

The next Accu-Stats issue will feature "The North Carolina Fall 9-Ball Classic" hosted by Rob's Roost in Charlotte, North Carolina. The \$10,000 added event immediately followed the U.S. Open on November 12-16, 1985. Earl Strickland defeated Filipino Jose Parica in the final match.
