OF THE 361 PLAYERS WHO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN AT LEAST ONE MAJOR 9-BALL EVENT IN 1985, 143 HAVE SHARED \$438,192.00. LAST YEAR, 388 PLAYERS PARTICIPATED AND 123 SHARED \$433,512.00.

IN 1985, SEVEN PLAYERS SHARED THE WINNER'S CIRCLE. LAST YEAR, EIGHT PLAYERS, BUT FOR BOTH YEARS COMBINED, ELEVEN DIFFERENT PLAYERS WON THE TWENTY-FIVE MAJOR 9-BALL TOURNAMENTS.

1 Loss + 12 Wins \$10,000

After a first round loss, Filipino Efren Reyes won the next twelve matches in a row to snap off the Sands Regent II \$10,000 first prize. Of the twenty-six .900's, Reyes shot seven of them.

The event was produced by The Great American Tour and The Keystone Cue and Cushion. It was promoter Gene Stary's second and most successful casino event to be hosted by The Sands Regent Hotel & Casino. The Sands added \$20,000 and spread out the \$40,700 purse twenty-four places. The event drew sixty-nine entrants who paid \$300 apiece to participate.

Doug Klisch, with the assistance of his wife Geri, ably directed the well organized event. Hank Pericle kept the flow chart in order while Jay Helfert managed the very capable referees with one assigned to each of the eight Gold Crown III tables. The players chose to rack for themselves so the referees

Notable Matches

This issue we will review a dozen of the Sands Regent II's most exciting matches. The number in parentheses is the player's TPA for that session.

In the classic tradition of Lou Butera (.929), he disposed of Cole Dickson (.833) in thirty minutes 9-2.

Once again the fickle finger of fate played its role after Efren Reyes (.838) took a commanding lead 8-5 over Jerry Chappel (.825). Reyes broke and appeared to be out when he made the seven and scratched. Score 8-6. Next rack, while pocketing the fifth ball, he scratched again. Score 8-7. Chappel broke and ran out which included a kick-in. Score 8-8. During the wire game, Reyes miscued while kicking. Chappel ran four and played safe. Reyes tried to return the safety with a thin hit but missed the whole ball. Chappel took no

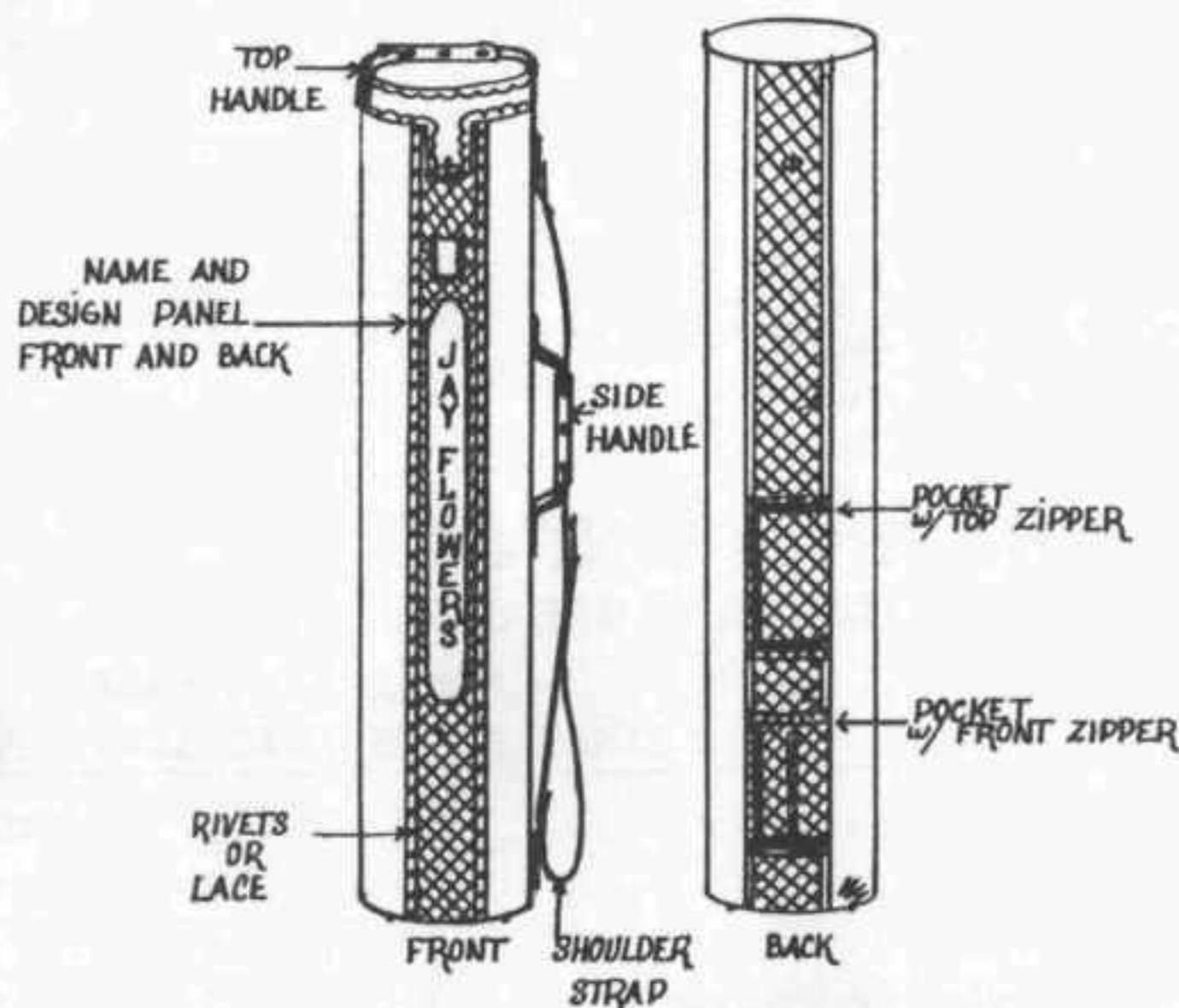
Winchenbaugh Warms Up with Pro-Am Win

RENO, NV (11/30-12/1/85) - Ninety-six players of all calibers swarmed to the Sands Regent Hotel-Casino and posted \$50.00 to compete in the Pro-Am division and share in the \$6,800 purse. The closed-out tournament, produced by Gene Stary, utilized his highly successful USPPA handicap system which incidentally was the key to the successful ten day program. The pro event, although successful, drew only sixty-nine contestants.

Half of the field (48) was in-the-money with the top prize of \$1,200 going to veteran Al "The Plumber" Winchenbaugh of Redwood City, California. He defeated Joe Salazar in the final two-out-of-three sets. Twenty-seven professionals tried their luck in the handicap event and it was not uncommon for a pro to give a two or three game handicap in the race to six! Yet, time and time again, it was proven that the underdog did indeed need those games as countless matches ended 6-5.

Gene Stary's first Pro-Am casino event in June drew forty-eight players. In view of the latest field

Below is the double elimination flow chart for the Sands Regent II. The bold center line separates the winner's bracket from the loser's bracket. The names bordering the center line are the results of the first round of play. For example, DiLiberto defeated Zimmerman. This technique reduces the standard chart's height in half while still displaying the results of the

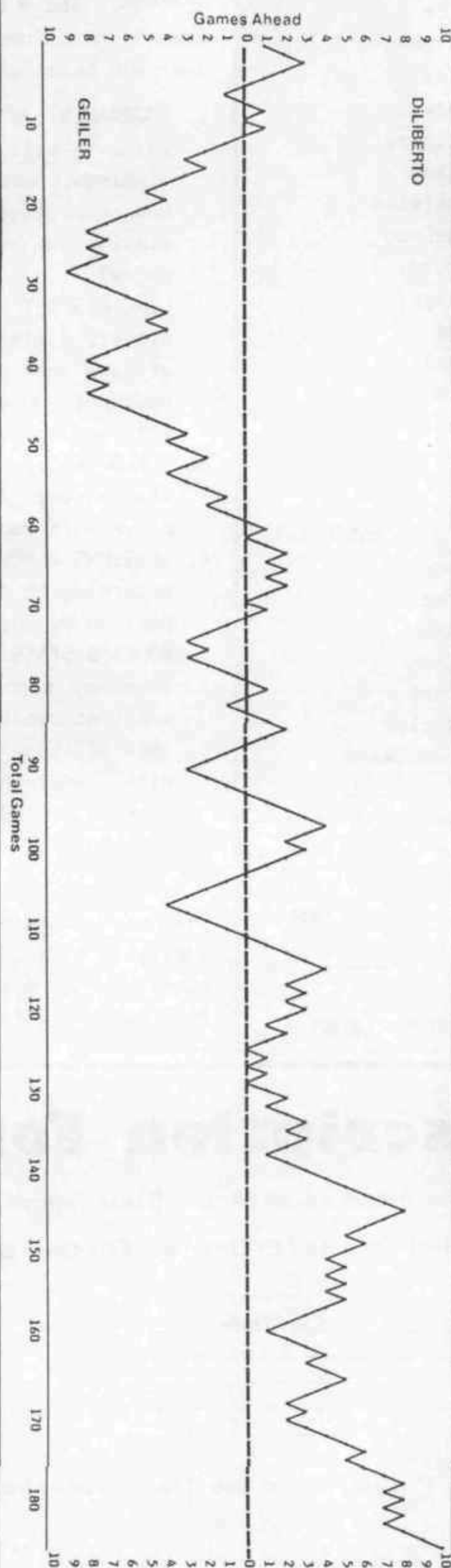
